The extended release version should never be crushed, chewed, or broken because doing so releases the entire twelve hour dose at once, which can cause fatal respiratory depression.

Patients who benefit from oxycodone typically have conditions like advanced cancer, severe back injuries, post surgical pain that does not respond to other medications, or chronic pain syndromes where all other treatments have failed. Your doctor will conduct a thorough evaluation before prescribing oxycodone to ensure that the benefits outweigh the risks.

Chapter Two: How To Use Oxycodone Safely And Effectively

Using oxycodone correctly is essential for both pain relief and personal safety. The medication should be taken exactly as prescribed by your doctor. Do not change your dose or take oxycodone more frequently than directed.

Take oxycodone with or without food as directed by your doctor. Some people prefer taking it with food if they experience stomach upset. Swallow the immediate release tablets whole with water. The extended release tablets must be swallowed whole and should never be crushed, chewed, broken, or dissolved.

Your doctor will determine your starting dose based on whether you have taken opioids before. For patients who have never taken opioids, the starting dose is typically five to fifteen milligrams every four to six hours as needed for pain. For patients who have taken opioids before, the starting dose may be higher based on their previous dose and tolerance level.

Take oxycodone exactly when you need it for pain. Do not wait until the pain becomes severe because the medication works best when taken at the first sign of pain. However, do not take it more often than prescribed. If your prescribed dose does not control your pain adequately, talk to your doctor rather than increasing the dose on your own.

If you are prescribed the extended release version, take it at the same time each day. This maintains consistent levels of medication in your bloodstream and provides steady pain relief throughout the day and night. Take the extended release tablet exactly every twelve hours.

Do not stop taking oxycodone suddenly if you have been taking it regularly for more than a few weeks. Abrupt discontinuation can cause withdrawal symptoms including anxiety, sweating, nausea, diarrhea, muscle aches, and insomnia. Your doctor will help you taper off the medication gradually when it is time to stop.

Chapter Three: Side Effects You May Experience

Like all medications, oxycodone can cause side effects. Understanding these helps you know what to expect and when to contact your doctor.

The most common side effects affect more than ten percent of users. These include constipation, nausea, vomiting, drowsiness, dizziness, lightheadedness, dry mouth, and headache. Constipation is extremely common with opioid use and often requires proactive management including increased water intake, dietary fiber, and sometimes stool softeners or laxatives.

Less common side effects affect between one and ten percent of users. These include loss of appetite, stomach pain, anxiety, confusion, mood changes, difficulty urinating, decreased libido, and sweating. Some patients experience itching or skin rashes.

Serious side effects requiring immediate medical attention are rare but important to recognize. Respiratory depression is the most dangerous side effect. Signs include slow or shallow breathing, blue tint to the lips or fingernails, extreme drowsiness from which you cannot be woken, and confusion. If you notice any of these signs in yourself or someone else who has taken oxycodone, call 911 immediately.

Other serious side effects include severe constipation that does not respond to treatment, signs of adrenal insufficiency such as worsening fatigue and low blood pressure, and allergic reactions including hives, swelling of the face or throat, and difficulty breathing.

Many side effects improve after the first few days of treatment as your body adjusts to the medication. Do not stop taking oxycodone because of mild side effects without talking to your doctor. Your doctor may have suggestions for managing side effects or may adjust your dose.

Chapter Four: Important Warnings You Must Know

Oxycodone carries several important warnings that every patient should understand before taking this medication.

The FDA requires a Boxed Warning on oxycodone regarding the risk of addiction, abuse, and misuse. Opioid medications have a high potential for addiction even when taken exactly as prescribed. The risk is higher in patients with a personal or family history of substance abuse, but it exists for everyone. Misuse of oxycodone can cause overdose and death.

Another Boxed Warning addresses life threatening respiratory depression. Oxycodone can cause slow or shallow breathing that can lead to brain damage or death if not treated promptly. This risk is highest when starting the medication, when the dose is increased, or when oxycodone is combined with other central nervous system depressants.

A third Boxed Warning addresses the risks of concurrent use with benzodiazepines or other central nervous system depressants. Combining oxycodone with alcohol, benzodiazepines like diazepam or alprazolam, muscle relaxants, or sleep aids can cause profound sedation, respiratory depression, coma, and death. Avoid these combinations completely.

The fourth Boxed Warning addresses neonatal opioid withdrawal syndrome. If you take oxycodone during pregnancy, your baby may be born dependent on the medication and experience withdrawal symptoms after birth. These symptoms can be life threatening and require treatment in a neonatal intensive care unit.

Oxycodone is a Schedule II controlled substance under the Controlled Substances Act. This classification indicates a high potential for abuse and severe psychological or physical dependence. Prescriptions for Schedule II drugs cannot be refilled. You must obtain a new prescription from your doctor each time you need more medication.

Chapter Five: Before You Take This Medicine

Before your doctor prescribes oxycodone, you need to provide a complete medical history. Do not take oxycodone if you are allergic to oxycodone or any other opioid medication.

Tell your doctor about any breathing problems including asthma, sleep apnea, or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. Oxycodone can suppress breathing, which may worsen these conditions. Your doctor may need to monitor you more closely or choose a different medication.

Tell your doctor if you are pregnant, plan to become pregnant, or are breastfeeding. Oxycodone can harm your baby and passes into breast milk. If you become pregnant while taking oxycodone, tell your doctor immediately.

Chapter Six: What To Avoid While Taking Oxycodone

Several substances and activities should be avoided while taking oxycodone to prevent dangerous interactions and side effects.

Avoid alcohol completely while taking oxycodone. Alcohol increases the sedative effects of oxycodone and can cause dangerous respiratory depression. The combination also impairs judgment and coordination more severely than either substance alone. Never drink alcohol while taking oxycodone.

Avoid driving or operating machinery until you know how oxycodone affects you. The medication can cause drowsiness, dizziness, and impaired coordination.
